

2020 Results



In collaboration with its Haitian partners, The KANPE Foundation supports families and their communities as they work to achieve autonomy by strengthening six essential pillars: health and nutrition, food security and climate resilience, education, entrepreneurship, leadership, and improvement of local infrastructure.

In keeping with our mission, here are our 2020 onsite result-driven achievements*:

HEALTH AND NUTRITION

Care and prevention services offered to 17,000 residents (Baille Tourible and surrounding communities). Available data for 2020 show that the clinic** offered daily care through its various services:

- Consultations* (monthly average of 864).
- Laboratory tests (monthly average of 304).
- Free distribution of medication.
- Treatment of moderate and severe malnutrition (monthly average of 18 children).
- No new cases of cholera since January 2018.
- Prenatal consultations (monthly average of 148 families) and childbirth (41).
- Family planning services (monthly average of 800 people).
- Sexuality training offered to the adult population and adolescents in the areas of reproductive health, personal hygiene, environmental health, pediatrics, and STD/HIV prevention.

- Transportation service for patients, medical team members, and medications.
- Hiring of 6 new staff members. 29 jobs maintained at the clinic, including: general practitioner, nursing assistants, pharmacy assistants, social worker, primary care nurses, medical technologists, and a pharmacist.
- **Actions related to the COVID-19 pandemic:**
 - Training and implementation of new safety protocols for the prevention of COVID-19 infection.
 - Installation of 4 water stations at the clinic and at the public school for hand washing to prevent infection by COVID-19.
 - Training and deployment of a dozen young people in the population to inform about COVID-19 and raise awareness about its prevention methods - 1902 families reached and visited 2 times each.
 - Distribution of prevention and protection materials against COVID-19 to our beneficiaries including :
 - 1,500 washable masks;
 - 3,814 sanitary kits including soap and chlorine for water;
 - Information and awareness posters installed at key points in the territory;
 - Purchase and commissioning of an ambulance vehicle to transport the very sick to a larger health facility.

* Data as of November 30, 2020. This year, the COVID-19 pandemic and various measures taken to reduce its spread forced us to slow down or even stop certain activities for a few months in the community we support.

** A drop in clinic attendance occurred during the first months of the pandemic between April and June (due to fear of stigmatization).
